Asia Pacific Regional Internet Governance Forum

Asia Pacific Regional Internet Governance Forum (APrIGF) serves as a platform for discussion, exchange and collaboration at a regional level, and also where possible to aggregate national IGF discussions, ultimately advance the Internet governance development in the Asia Pacific region.

In 2010, while the global IGF is already in its fifth and final year of its initial charter, and Regional IGFs have been established in many other regions, including Africa, Europe, Latin America and the Caribbean, to date, Asia has seen no parallel forum for discussing Internet governance issues at a regional level. For the first time, the APrIGF is therefore being convened with objectives to raise awareness and encourage participation from relevant stakeholders around the region on Internet governance issues, as well as to foster multi-lateral, multi-stakeholder discussion about issues pertinent to the Internet in Asia.

The multi-stakeholder approach is a core principle of the APrIGF with the emphasis on the diversity of participants and openness of the discussion. Valuing the youth as an important stakeholder and the future generations of the Internet, a Youth IGF also become an integral part of the APrIGF whereby they are held in parallel annually featuring a simulation of the multi-stakeholder discussion model among the young people on various Internet governance issues.



Ministry of Digital Affairs

The Ministry of Digital Affairs (MODA), responsible for driving Taiwan's digital development, will connect citizens and technology, improve industry and security, fulfill the goal of a smart country, and continue to lead the world via the Taiwan model.

Only a solid digital infrastructure can ensure that digital applications in everyday life function as intended. The moda will continue improving the broadband application environment, shaping a diverse innovation ecosystem, and promoting and establish standards and self-regulation mechanisms allowing anyone to access public services. This will facilitate smooth interdepartmental communication and promote further realization of equality and democracy.

Given the Internet's decentralization and fast iteration, the government is taking a different approach to algorithm and data regulation. The moda will support civil servants in developing the necessary digital competencies, while using the current ethos of open government and citizen participation to provide flexibility. At the vanguard of these efforts are the people-public-private partnership ecosystem, championed by the Presidential Hackathon. Maintaining ongoing real-time cooperation with residents serves as a motivator for policy innovation and a glue for social mutual trust.



Taiwan Internet Governance Forum

The Taiwan Internet Governance Forum (TWIGF) is a communication and interaction platform, where various stakeholders in the internet ecosystem come together to discuss public policies related to the internet. These stakeholders include government, academia, technical communities, civil society, and private sector entities. Internet governance involves the development and implementation of common principles, guidelines, rules, decision-making processes, and strategies by global stakeholders based on their respective roles. The goal is to regulate global internet development and usage.

International discussions on internet governance cover a wide range of public policy issues, including technical, economic, legal, social, cultural, and developmental aspects. These discussions involve stakeholders collectively addressing topics such as internet openness, security, universal access, multiculturalism, and the protection of critical internet resources.



Taiwan Network Information Center

The Taiwan Network Information Center (TWNIC) serves a dual role as the ccTLD Manager for .tw/.台灣 and the National Internet Registry responsible for distributing Internet resources in Taiwan. TWNIC is committed to delivering world-class services to its members, engaging with stakeholders, and collaborating with international Internet organizations to uphold the principles of good governance and support Internet development in Taiwan, in the APAC region, and globally.

TWNIC is dedicated to building the brands of Taiwan in the digital world. TWNIC strives to increase brand awareness, build domain value, and enable organizations and businesses in Taiwan to establish a distinct online presence that reflects their digital identities with the .tw and .台灣 domain names.

Community engagement is another significant aspect of TWNIC's operations. TWNIC supports the multistakeholder model of Internet governance, and also collaborates with stakeholders, the Internet community, and international organizations such as ICANN and APNIC to promote Internationalized Domain Names (IDNs), Resource Public Key Infrastructure (RPKI), DNSSEC, routing security, and cybersecurity best practices, advocating for a global, open, stable, and secure Internet.

As a member of the Internet community, TWNIC aims to play an active role in hosting Internet governance events and fostering discussions on important Internet governance topics. TWNIC constantly engages with Internet communities by hosting the ICANN APAC-TWNIC Engagement Forum, the IP Open Policy Meeting, and relevant joint trainings, while supporting initiatives like the Taiwan Internet Governance Forum (TWIGF). These events serve as platforms for community members to exchange ideas, share best practices, and collectively build norms on crucial Internet issues. TWNIC also constantly conducts research like the Taiwan Internet Report to illustrate Taiwan's Internet development, for users and researchers to understand the important issues and the development in Taiwan.

TWNIC thrives as Taiwan's Internet landscape evolves and remains dedicated to adapting and innovating the services to meet the dynamic needs of the members and contribute actively to the global Internet community, to build a better Internet together. As the local host of APriGF 2024, TWNIC welcomes the participants to the events to share and discuss the overarching Internet governance topics.

About APrIGF and TWIGF 2024



The Asia Pacific Regional Internet Governance Forum (APrIGF) and the Taiwan Internet Governance Forum (TWIGF) 2024 were jointly held from August 21 to 23 at the NTUH International Convention Center in Taipei. Hosted collaboratively by TWNIC, the event featured a hybrid format, enabling both in-person and virtual participation. The overarching theme of this year's APrIGF was "Evolving Ecosystems, Enduring Principles: Shaping Responsible Internet Governance," which reflected the forum's emphasis on sustainable and principled practices in Internet governance. Meanwhile, TWIGF's theme was "Rethinking Internet Governance: Artificial Intelligence, Resilience, Sustainability, and Security," addressing a broad range of public policy issues related to Internet governance. This combined event fostered collaboration and dialogue among stakeholders from government, academia, civil society, and the private sector.

APrIGF2024 Theme & Sub theme

Evolving Ecosystems, Enduring Principles: Shaping Responsible Internet Governance

As connectivity increases across the Asia-Pacific region, the Internet governance landscape continues to undergo rapid transformation. However, challenges such as inclusion, safety, affordability, and digital rights remain. This event explored how to effectively address these ongoing issues while maintaining a focus on the core principles of openness, decentralization, and accessibility, particularly in the context of emerging technologies and artificial intelligence (AI).

Thematic Tracks

- **Security & Trust:** This track addressed the ongoing challenges of cybersecurity, data privacy, and online safety. The discussions emphasized the importance of trust, accountability, and cooperation among stakeholders in governance processes. It explored how collaborative efforts can address complex security concerns, protect personal data, and enhance online safety for all users.
- **Resilience:** This track focused on ensuring the reliability of Internet infrastructure through multi-stakeholder collaboration. The goal was to empower communities to shape their digital futures in ways that meet their socio-economic priorities. The discussions also emphasized how resilient digital infrastructures can help mitigate disruptions and ensure continued access and communication in the face of growing cyberthreats.
- **Ethical Governance of Emerging Technologies:** This track examined how to balance innovation with ethical governance for emerging technologies like AI. The discussions highlighted the need for governance frameworks that prioritize privacy, fairness, and transparency. As AI and other technologies evolve, the goal is to foster innovation while ensuring these technologies serve society responsibly.


TWIGF2024 Theme & Sub theme

Rethinking Internet Governance: AI, Resilience, Sustainability, and Security

The rapid development of artificial intelligence (AI) presents both challenges and opportunities for internet governance. To maintain an open, stable, and secure internet, it is essential to foster multistakeholder collaboration in this shifting technological landscape.

Sub-Themes

- **AI Development and Application:** The widespread integration of AI in various sectors introduces critical issues concerning legal compliance, ethics, and privacy. Stakeholders must collaborate to ensure responsible AI development, safeguarding human rights and promoting social justice.
- **Resilience and Sustainability:** As climate change and geopolitical tensions escalate, strengthening the resilience of internet infrastructure is paramount. Discussions focus on achieving sustainable digital growth, while addressing the societal and environmental impacts of technological advancements.
- **Security:** The rise of cybersecurity threats demands robust defense strategies that do not compromise internet openness. Effective cooperation is key to enhancing security and building trust, with AI playing a pivotal role in preventing cyberattacks and protecting privacy.








Overall Forum Rating

A Vibrant Gathering

This year's APriGF has 1060 registrations, and brought together over 671 physical participants and 1674 online participations from diverse sectors, including academia, civil society, government, youth and the private sector. Among those registered, the event achieved excellent gender balance: approximately 49% male, 46% female, and 5% identifying as non-binary or preferring not to say.
